Module: Scene Management

**Overview** 

Scene management is a critical aspect of accident response, involving systematic

approaches to ensure safety and evidence preservation.

Coordinated planning is essential for establishing cordon areas and controlling access to

the site. Early assessment of the scene allows responders to identify hazards and

prioritize actions effectively.

Technical areas of evidence must be preserved to support investigations, requiring

careful documentation and collection procedures. In cases of mass casualties,

temporary mortuaries may be established for Disaster Victim Identification (DVI)

efforts.

Additionally, personal property recovery by police is essential for supporting victims'

families. By employing coordinated planning and recovery techniques, responders can

enhance the effectiveness and safety of accident scene management.
