

Module: Airworthiness Directive (AD)

Overview

Airworthiness Directives (ADs) are regulatory measures issued to address safety concerns regarding aircraft design or maintenance.

Regulations established under AN(HK)O 1995 outline the requirements for compliance with ADs, ensuring that operators take necessary actions to mitigate safety risks. HKAR 1.6-6 and HKAR 21.3B detail the responsibilities of operators in relation to AD compliance.

Proper application of ADs is crucial for maintaining airworthiness and operational safety. Alternative Means of Compliance (AMOC) may be accepted when they provide equivalent safety levels. Understanding the applicability and compliance requirements of ADs is essential for operators to ensure that their aircraft remain safe and airworthy.
